<p>To demonstrate the acquisition of the musical, plastic and body expression fundamentals of the Pre-school Education curriculum.</p> <p>To understand and know how to use games as a playful means to encourage the development of motor skills but also to express feelings and emotions, as well as to accept rules and acquire values.</p> <p>To be able to design teaching methods and strategies, as well as to know how to use different and innovative resources, such as information and communication technologies, the plastic expression workshop, artistic works, musical language, in order to foster in the Pre-school Education pupils their interest and sensitivity for artistic, musical and corporal expressions.</p>
Assessment systems*
<p>Modalities of assessment</p> <p>According to the regulations in force at the University of Extremadura (26 October 2020, Evaluation Regulations of the official Bachelor's and Master's Degrees of the UEX), two types of assessment are recognised: continuous and global.</p> <p>Students will choose the type of assessment during the first quarter of the teaching period, as stated in the aforementioned assessment regulations. When a student does not request global assessment in the space provided for this purpose on the virtual campus, it will be understood that he/she opts for continuous assessment. Once the type of assessment has been chosen, the student will not be able to change it in the ordinary call of that semester and will abide by the assessment regulations for the extraordinary call.</p> <p>Average mark, in order to calculate an average mark it is necessary to have a minimum mark of passing in each of the two parts that comprise the subject.</p> <p>The teaching plan of the subject foresees for all the calls a final alternative test of global character, so that the passing of this one supposes the passing of the subject. 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between the system of continuous assessment or the system of assessment with a single comprehensive final test is up to the student during the first three weeks of each semester.

Global assessment mode

Students who choose this mode and inform the teaching staff in writing, during the first quarter of the first semester must take a global test as stated in the current regulations of the University of Extremadura (Resolution of 26 October 2020).

The continuous evaluation corresponding to Musical Expression, will be developed in the following way: Attendance, involvement and active participation in the classes together with the activities of the course will be taken into account. The final mark will be based on the performance of the exam, which is 40% of the mark, the individual practical activities, 20%; and the group work expositions, 40%. The work will be done on topics proposed in class, so that the student demonstrates the acquisition and development of knowledge and aspects covered in class. Originality and scientific rigor will be positively valued, as well as the viability of its application in the educational reality. The oral exposition will consist of a presentation of the results obtained and a brief practical case in class with the participation of the rest of the students. The clarity and originality of the presentation will be valued, as well as the simultaneity between new technologies and traditional techniques.

The continuous evaluation corresponding to Plastic Expression will be developed in the following way: Taking into account the active attendance of the student, the elaboration of works, the expositions in class, the participation in the sessions dealing with the resolution of cases and the accomplishment of midterm exams or final exam. In this sense, the works will represent 40% of the grade with non recoverable character; the written works, 20%; and the final exam, 40%. In the oral expositions and written works, correct expression and spelling will be taken into account. In order to pass the part corresponding to Plastic Expression, all the practical and theoretical exams must be passed. The final mark will be the average percentage between the passed practical part and the passed theoretical part.

Overall evaluation

(a) An extra theoretical and practical test with questions on that part that you have not done in person (50 per cent)

b) Other evaluation tests that can be taken or handed in on the day of the exam and that will have been determined beforehand (50%). In this modality, students will have to inform themselves about the foreseen tests.

The grading system in force at any given time will be applied, currently: 0-4.9 Fail (SS); 5.0-6.9: Passed (AP); 7.0-8.9: Notable (NT); 9.0-10: Outstanding (SB). Honourable Mention may be awarded to students who have earned a grade of 9.0 or higher. Their number may not exceed 5% of the students enrolled in a subject in the corresponding academic year.
